

Tenders Received for the Second Instalment of the Deal Central School (7th February 1936)

DEAL'S NEW SCHOOL.

The Deal Education Committee reported at the Council meeting on Tuesday that five tenders were received for the erection of the second instalment of the Central School in Mill Hill, and that of Messrs. Rice and Son, Ltd., of Margate, amounting to £16,856 was the lowest and was accepted. The plans have been approved by the Board of Education, and sanction obtained to the estimated expenditure of £18,045 12s. 6d., made up as follows:—Tender, £16,856; architect's fees and clerk of work's salary, £1167; stamp duty, £23 12s. 6d. It is desired to have the remainder of the school available for occupation at the beginning of January next. The Council are also asked to obtain sanction to a loan of £500 to cover the cost of furnishing the first instalment of the same school.
